So I designed a simple and easy-to-make vase.

Now it's your turn to showcase your crochet plants or dried flowers. Grab your hooks!

Vase

Materials

Hook 4mm

Hobbii cotton yarn (Friends Cotton 8/8), color Oatmilk (O3)

Scissors

Yarn needle

Abbreviations (US Terms)

mr : magic ring

sc : single crochet

slst : slip stitch

blo : back loop only

hdc : half double crochet

inc : increase

dec : decrease

Instructions

R1. 6sc in a MR

R2. 6inc (12)

R3. (1sc, inc) *6 (18)

R4. (2sc, inc) *6 (24)

R5. (3sc, inc) *6 (30)

R6. (4sc, inc) *6 (36)

R7. (5sc, inc) *6 (42)

R8. (6sc, inc) *6 (48)

R9. (7sc, inc) *6 (54)

R10. 54sc in blo only

R11 to R12. 54 sc (2 rows)

R13. (8sc, inc) *6 (60)

R14 à R27. 60sc (14 rows)

R28. (8sc, dec) *6 (54)

R29. (7sc, dec) *6 (48)

R30. (6sc, dec) *6 (42)

R31. (5sc, dec) *6 (36)

R32. (4sc, dec) *6 (30)

R33 à R39. 30sc (7 rows)

R40. (5sc, inc) *6 (36)

R41. (1slst, 2hdc in the same stitch) *18 (54)

Finish off at the end of round 41 and weave in the ends.

For a cleaner shape (and to round out the vase nicely), I add a little stuffing. This step is optional.
